From the Interim Moderator

Dear Friends,

I have changed hats! I have been accustomed to sitting (although rather irregularly! I do have an excuse!) in the pew on Sunday mornings rather than wearing my clerical collar. However, now I have a new role within the congregation. I was appointed as the Interim Moderator at Barnhill St Margaret's by the Presbytery of Perth when the Rev Dr Andrew Gardner completed his time as our Interim Minister. I wish to thank Andrew for his ministry and leaving the congregation in such good heart. I would ask you to remember Andrew in your prayers as he begins as the Interim Minister at Dunblane: St Blane's linked with Lecropt.

You have recently heard during Sunday worship edicts regarding the Electoral Roll which is required for a future Congregational vote, and I am indebted to the Session Clerks, Church Secretary and the Kirk Session for compiling the Electoral Roll. The Electoral Roll is required when the congregation will be asked to vote 'For' or 'Against' the proposed union of the churches in Barnhill & Broughty Ferry. The united church will be called Broughty Ferry Parish Church. More will be said about this matter and explained to the congregation prior to any Congregational vote.

The Kirk Session has agreed to appoint as Locum Minister the Rev Lorna H Tunstall who was the Probationer Minister at Barnhill St Margaret's. Lorna has recently demitted as Minister at Clyne linked with Kildonan and Loth Helmsdale. Lorna will begin as the Locum Minister on the 10 October 2023. I am pleased Lorna has joined the ministry team at Barnhill St Margaret's and I would ask you to give her a warm welcome as she begins her ministry with us. As Interim Moderator, you will see me in the pew, but still irregularly! I will occasionally be in the pulpit! I will be working with the Kirk Session in the coming days regarding the union of the churches. I am delighted to play my small part in the ministry of Barnhill St Margaret's and I know from my knowledge of the Kirk Session and Congregation you will play your part in securing the future of our church, so Christian worship and ministry continues in this area for many years to come.
